#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- The Aledo Farmers Market & Bake Sale had an increase in both the number of participating vendors and total sales in 2022. There were a total of 22 vendors that set-up throughout the entire farmers market season. There was a total of \$21,738 in vendor sales for the season. The average number of shoppers was 152 per week.
- Aledo Main Street and the Mercer Foundation for Health created a new event called "The Gathering Table" it was a benefit dinner with proceeds going towards the Mercer County & Sherrard School District Backpack Programs to help serve those with food insecurities. Attendees of the benefit dinner had a meal prepared and/or presented from local Aledo & Mercer County restaurants. Many ingredients were also purchased or donated by local farmers market vendors for a farm-to-table experience with an emphasize in supporting local establishments & agriculture. This benefit dinner also included an "auction" that raised over \$14,000 for the backpack programs.

#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS CONT'D**

- New Executive Director was hired in April. This is an accomplishment that the Executive Director for Aledo Main Street has always been a part time position. It is currently a full time position in thanks to a contribution from the City of Aledo.
- We were able to award 3-\$600 scholarships to a graduating senior at MCHS looking to further their education. The scholarship voting was significantly different than prior years, by having students write on the importance of shopping and supporting local businesses. They were to write an essay and then clips of essay were recorded and posted to the AMS FB page and played through WRMJ radio.
- Decorated Downtown Aledo on College Ave & Main St for both Fall and Winter. Fall Streetscapes were expanded to include more street posts throughout the sidewalks. Winter decorating included planter boxes along the sidewalks among decorating several available storefront buildings with lights and holiday décor to help the festiveness throughout the buildings.
- There was 1 ribbon cutting for Daisy Bliss Beautique for their 1 year Anniversary. There was 1 other new business that opened up in Downtown Aledo in 2022 and that was Midtown Burger Club located at 133 W. Main St.

#### SOCIAL MEDIA REACH

Aledo Main Street Facebook page reached 69,450. This means our posts reached over 69,000 people in 2022. This is up 47% from 2021. Our Facebook page had 384 NEW page "likes". This is an increase of 27%. The AMS FB page had 7,561 visits throughout 2022 which is an increase of 45% since 2021. That's an average of 630 people visiting our social media page a month.
